What is IGRC?

Indigenous Girls Rock Camp (IGRC) is the premiere program launched by Spirit of a Woman. IGRC is created in partnership with the Girls Rock Camp international organization to bring a first of its kind “indigenized” version of the program to Wisconsin’s tribal communities.

IGRC is a 7-day empowerment music camp for girls ages 8-18. The camp provides unique programming that combines music education, performance, and leadership development. Under the direction of professional female music instructors, girls will: learn an instrument; form a band; write an original song; and perform a live concert. The program is designed to build girls’ self-esteem, find their voices and ROCK!
